# Ghosts of Christmas Specials Past at BFI Southbank



Escape the cold and the hustle and bustle of Christmas shopping by visiting BFI Southbank this festive season; sit back, relax and enjoy a small but perfectly formed look back at Christmas TV Specials of yesteryear on the big screen. Featuring the likes of Eric Sykes, Robbie the Reindeer, Dame Edna Everage and Eric Idle, Ghosts of Christmas Specials Past will deliver seasonal cheer in abundance! BFI will also offer Christmas treats in the form of a new BFI Mediatheque collection Santa's Grotto which will include such classics as The Morecambe and Wise Christmas Show (1980) and The Snowman (1982). In a royal year like no other, during which HRH Queen Elizabeth II even visited BFI Southbank, it is only fitting that this mediatheque collection will also include The Queen's very first televised Christmas Day speech from 1957. Royal content doesn't stop there, BFI Mediatheques around the country will also feature such gems as Royal Family (1969) which covers a typical year in the life of the Queen and her family, and showed for the first time the behind-scenes existence of the Royal Family in both their off-duty moments and official engagements.

**Camp Christmas** will feature two festive delights, the first is **Christmas Snowtime Special** (BBC, 1979) – ABBA, Boney M and Kate Bush appear in this outlandish affair hosted by Dame Edna Everage. Meanwhile The Goodies and Richard Wattis join the team for a pun laden show in **Crackerjack Christmas Pantomime: The Story of Aladdin** (BBC, 1974).

We'll also salute the comedic genius of **Eric Sykes** who died earlier this year with a programme dedicated to this comedy giant. This will include two seasonal episodes from Sykes' popular sitcom **Sykes: Christmas Party** (BBC 1975) and **Sykes: Christmas Special** (BBC 1977) as well as an extended Christmas Day edition of **This is Your Life** (ITV, 1979) in which Sykes is the recipient of the famous Big Red Book.

A collection of festive entertainment from the wilder side of life has been compiled for *Madcap Christmas*, including *The Telegoons: The International Christmas Pudding* (BBC, 1963) and *Eric Idle's* marvellous post-Python satire *Rutland Weekend Television Christmas* (BBC, 1975). Michael Bentine and his band of merry men, including the late Clive Dunn, will provide a mix of lunatic mayhem in *It's a Square World* and cult Claymation favourite *Rex the Runt* (BBC, 1998) will close the proceedings with its truly original and absurdist humour.

A collection of 1990s **Animated Christmas** classics will provide an evening of entertainment suitable for all the family. **Famous Fred** (C4, 1996) is the tale of a feline singing sensation, voiced by **Lenny Henry** and based on the charming book by Posy Simmonds (*Tamara Drewe*); while **The Mousehole Cat** (BBC, 1994) tells the tale of a cat who, along with his master, must braves fierce storms to save their village from starvation. Finally, Robbie the Reindeer must overcome various obstacles if he is to win a place on Santa's crack sled team in **Hooves of Fire** (BBC, 1999). This fast-paced comedy cartoon is enhanced no end by an all-star voice cast including **Steve Googan**, **Paul Whitehouse** and **Jane Horrocks**.

As well as being haunted by Ghosts of Christmas Specials Past, audiences will be able to enjoy yuletide telly in BFI Mediatheques across the UK. The selection spans the period from **The Crazy Gang's Party** (1957) in the early days of ITV, to what many consider the pinnacle of the format, **The Morecambe and Wise Christmas Show** (1980). Further chaotic capers can be seen in **Rod Hull and Emu Sing a Christmas Song** (1976), **Carry on Christmas** (1969) and **Tommy Cooper's Christmas** (1973). **The Snowman** will offer a more melancholy take on the season, the animation having been a festive fixture since its first broadcast on Channel 4 in 1982.
