



PAOLO SORRENTINO'S OSCAR® WINNER THE GREAT BEAUTY ARRIVES ON BFI PLAYER

Following it's triumphant win in a hotly contested Best Foreign Language Film category at last night's Academy Awards®, Paolo Sorrentino's instant classic **THE GREAT BEAUTY** arrives on the BFI Player – perfect timing for film fans across the UK to catch up on what they might until now have missed out on.

Starring Sorrentino-alumni Toni Servillo (*The Consequences of Love*), **THE GREAT BEAUTY** tells the story of Jep Gambardella, a bachelor who, on his 65th birthday, looks past his former life of seduction and lavish partying in Rome to find a timeless landscape of absurd, exquisite beauty he never knew existed.

Released to widespread critical acclaim, **THE GREAT BEAUTY** was a fixture on many Best Of 2013 lists, notching up plenty of Awards along the way – the jewel in the crown being last night's Academy nod which guarantees global attention for a director who is becoming as synonymous with the city of Rome as the Colosseum.

Already a huge success following its launch in October, the BFI Player comes even further into its own in this month as the BFI's streaming service adds a host of great new content alongside Sorrentino's gong winner, all of which can be streamed from your computer, iPad, tablet or phone.
